



Summertime

One of the most popular garden ornaments is the butterfly. Flying into second place is the dragonfly. Dragonflies appear to be peaceful creatures flitting about your pond or backyard. They are in fact voracious predators, helping to control insects we humans detest. They consume small to medium-sized flying insects such as deer flies and mosquitos. They also enjoy all sorts of aquatic insects as well as small fish and tadpoles. They are indeed "dragon" like!

Virtually every body of water is home to dragonflies and damselflies. Ohio has seen a decline in recent years dues to stream and river pollution and the loss of wetlands.

Larger species fly at about 10 mph. However, when they are chasing prey, they can amp it up to 35 mph. They also have the ability to turn on a dime. Dragonflies have the ability to see clearly in multiple directions at the same time too. A dragonfly can spot a human standing still at 30' away. Wow!
